- 3. Mahatma Gandhi's birthday on Oct 2nd
















 Different regiments of the Indian Army, the Indian Navy and the Indian Air Force march and wear all fine uniforms and official decorations.























 The Chief Guest of the parade is a Head of State of another nation. Here is President Pratibha Patil with an international leader




The parade also includes many traditional dance troupes, to symbolize the cultural heritage of India.





















It traditionally ends with a colourful <u>flypast</u> by Air Force jets in a <u>tiranga</u> formation.
